

Turkey Handprint Craft



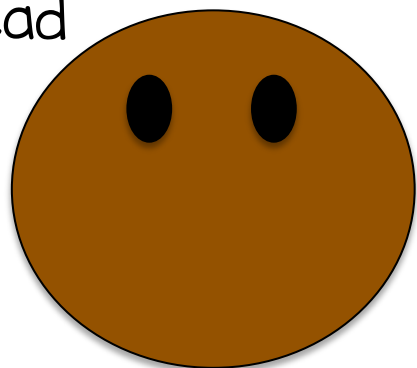
1. Give each student a copy of the Happy Thanksgiving Poem.
2. Paint their hand print with red, yellow, or orange finger paint and press down on the right side of the paper. As it dries, have them cut out (and color if applicable) the different parts of the turkey body.
Note: two options are given - one where all of the turkey parts need to be cut out and another where the turkey is grouped together, to make it easier for kids who are less comfortable cutting.
3. Once their handprint has dried, have them glue the body parts on top of the handprint (their fingers should look like feathers). Have them write their names (or have a teacher do it) at the end of the poem.
